QUALIFICATIONS: Groups meeting criteria items 1 - 6 above score 1 point each. A score of 4 or more points qualifies a group for a waiver or reduction of fees.

WAIVER OF FEES: All groups/organizations/sponsors requesting a Waiver of Fees must submit a completed Fee Waiver/Reduction Criteria Form with a letter detailing the event, which fees should be waived and verification of information requested on the criteria form (e.g., organization donates 50% of its budget-supporting programs in the Five Cities area). All forms and letters should be addressed to Chief of Police, Arroyo Grande Police Department, 200 N. Halcyon Road, Arroyo Grande, CA 93420.

DETERMINATION: All requests for the reduction or waiver of fees that require a Public Safety and Welfare Permit or Police Department Auxiliary Police Services will be reviewed by the Chief of Police. If the outcome is disputed, it can be appealed to the City Council.
