



NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

On **TUESDAY, JULY 28, 2015**, the Arroyo Grande City Council will conduct a public hearing at **6:00 P.M.** in the **COUNCIL CHAMBERS** at **215 E. BRANCH STREET** to consider the following item:

**CONSIDERATION OF CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 14-010; SALE OF DISTILLED SPIRITS; LOCATION – 1168 WEST BRANCH STREET; APPLICANT – WALMART STORES, INC.; REPRESENTATIVE – MALOU REYES, GRESHAM SAVAGE.** The City Council will consider an application for a Conditional Use Permit to authorize a Type 21 license from the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control to Walmart for the sale of distilled spirits. In compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Community Development Department has determined that the above project is categorically exempt per Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines. If the City Council does not feel that this determination is appropriate, project approval will not be considered.

The City Council may also discuss other hearings or business items before or after the item listed above. If you challenge the proposed action in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City Council at, or prior to, the public hearing. Comments may be either: (1) mailed or delivered in person to the Community Development Department at 300 East Branch Street, Arroyo Grande, CA or (2) provided in person at the Public Hearing. Failure of any person to receive the notice shall not constitute grounds for any court to invalidate the action of the legislative body for which the notice was given.
