NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

On **TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2015**, the Arroyo Grande City Council will conduct a public hearing at **6:00 P.M.** in the **COUNCIL CHAMBERS** at **215 E. BRANCH STREET** to consider the following:

**PUBLIC ART - STAFF PROJECT 14-006; CHUMASH BASKET AT 126 SOUTH MASON STREET AND HARRIET QUIMBY RELIEF BENCH AT 127 SHORT STREET; APPLICANT – ARROYO GRANDE IN BLOOM - PUBLIC ART COMMITTEE**

The City Council will consider two (2) public art proposals. The first is located at 126 South Mason Street and includes an original artistic rendition of a Northern Chumash basket. The second piece is located at 127 Short Street and includes a Village style bench with a bronze relief of Harriet Quimby. The purpose of the hearing is to provide an opportunity for the community to comment on the proposals. Prior to the meeting, the art proposals were referred to a public art panel in accordance with the City's Public Art Guidelines.

The City Council may also discuss other hearings or business items before or after the item listed above. If you challenge the proposed action in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City Council at, or prior to, the public hearing. Comments may be either: (1) mailed or delivered in person to the Community Development Department at 300 East Branch Street, Arroyo Grande, CA or (2) provided in person at the Public Hearing.

Failure of any person to receive the notice shall not constitute grounds for any court to invalidate the action of the legislative body for which the notice was given.
