NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**


On **TUESDAY, JUNE 14, 2016**, the Arroyo Grande City Council will conduct a public hearing at **6:00 P.M.** in the **COUNCIL CHAMBERS** at **215 E. BRANCH STREET** to consider the following item:

CONSIDERATION OF REALLOCATION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS FROM THE GRID ALTERNATIVES SOLAR AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT APPROVED IN YEAR 2011 TO FUND THE CITY'S MID-BLOCK CROSSWALK ARCHITECTURAL BARRIER REMOVAL PROJECT. The City Council will consider a proposed resolution approving the reallocation of CDBG funds for Program Year 2011 to fund a project that provides access for people with disabilities at mid-block crosswalks throughout the City. In compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Community Development Department has determined that the allocation of CDBG funds is not considered a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). Specific projects that may have environmental impacts will be reviewed under CEQA and NEPA prior to implementation.

The City Council may also discuss other hearings or business items before or after the item listed above. If you challenge the proposed action in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City Council at, or prior to, the public hearing. Comments may be either: (1) mailed or delivered in person to the Community Development Department at 300 East Branch Street, Arroyo Grande, CA or (2) provided in person at the Public Hearing.

Failure of any person to receive the notice shall not constitute grounds for any court to invalidate the action of the legislative body for which the notice was given.
